REVIEW OF MARK Mark 1-16

DAY 1: MARK THE AUTHOR

DAY 2: JESUS

- 3. Several emphases surface in Mark's portrayal of Jesus. What did you learn about the following? Use verses given and others that you remember.
 - a. His authority (Mark 1:27; 2:10)
 - b. His power (Mark 4:39-41; 5:29-30; 9:25-27)
 - c. His teaching style (Mark 4:33-34; 9:35-37)
 - d. His relational skills (Mark 1:40-41; 6:30-34)

DAY 3: BEING HIS DISCIPLE

- 4. What have you learned about Christian discipleship from the Gospel of Mark?
- 5. Have you purposed to take some new steps or change direction in some area of your life as a result of this study? Be specific.
- 6. Choose your favorite memory verse from this course and write it here. Try to memorize it so that it comes to mind easily when you need it.

DAY 4: EQUIPPED BY THE WORD

NOTE: This study was never meant to be just an intellectual exercise or a time of accumulating more knowledge about Jesus; it was meant to be an intimate encounter with the living Christ who desires to touch and transform every aspect of your life! When considering the questions below, do not feel compelled to respond to those which, after careful consideration, do not relate to you.

 - b. What errors or misconceptions have been corrected in your belief system?
 - c. What changes have taken place in your attitudes?
- 8. Perhaps a particular person has ministered to you as you've been involved in this CBS study. Take time to affirm that individual through a private conversation or written note.

DAY 5: PROOF OF CHRIST'S DEITY

- 9. Browse through the book of Mark and read the side headings. Write out the side headings of those sections that were especially meaningful to you. This list can be your reminder of the most important truths you discovered during your study of Mark's Gospel.
- 10. Mark 1:1 and 15:39 both declare that Jesus is the Son of God. Mark has recounted the evidences of this in such a way that this truth is inescapable. As you browsed the side headings for Question 9, what, in the Gospel of Mark, do you consider to be the most convincing evidence of the deity of Jesus?

DAY 6: PARTICIPATE IN CLASS

APPLY what you have learned. Hopefully you have enjoyed your study of Mark's Gospel. You have probably learned a few things, encountered some new concepts, and deepened your knowledge of God and His Son Jesus Christ. However, you can never gain all the riches of knowledge from a book of the Bible in one go-around. When you revisit Mark sometime in the future, you will doubtless see something new that escaped your notice this time. The Word of God is so deep that each time we examine it, we discover more depth. But be assured that whatever God is teaching you at this point in your life will come through if you have your ears and heart open. Jesus said, "He who has ears to hear, let him hear" (Mark 4:9).
