- 6. What is the author suggesting when he says a "Sabbath rest" "remains" (4:9)?
- 7. Read Joshua 1:1-3; 13:1 and Judges 1:1; 2:6-13. What does Hebrews 4:8 confirm?

#### **DAY 6: PARTICIPATE IN CLASS**

**APPLY** what you have learned. In chapter 4, God's universal, infinite knowledge is emphasized: "No creature is hidden from His sight, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account" (4:13). How fearful and threatening this would be if God were not perfectly loving and willing to forgive and forget our sins. "He who confesses [his sins] and forsakes them will obtain mercy" (Proverbs 28:13).

As believers, we can "bare our souls" to God and know that He will not withdraw His love. It is impossible to hide our sins from God; if we try to do that, we are only deceiving ourselves. How can you make your relationship with God more open and honest today?
