HEBREWS LESSON 6

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A GREAT HIGH PRIEST

Hebrews 4:14-5:10

Memorize God's Word for the week: Hebrews 4:15-16.

Discuss review questions from the previous lesson.

DAY 1: HERREWS 4:14-16—THE DISTINCTION
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- 1. a. What are the distinctive characteristics of Jesus' priesthood shown in verse 14?
 - b. How does knowing what kind of priest Jesus is help us "hold fast our confession"?
- 2. State in your own words the incredible truths found in verses 15-16.

DAY 2: HEBREWS 5:1-3—THE IDENTIFICATION OF A PRIEST

- 3. Leviticus 9:1-7 records the beginning of the priests' ministry in Israel. Note the verses you use to answer the following questions.
 - a. Who is the designer of the sacrificial system?
 - b. What are the purposes of the offerings?
- 4. Read Leviticus 16:1-6, 11, 15-17 with Hebrews 5:1-3. State three or more facts about the work or person of a high priest.

DAY 3: HEBREWS 5:4-6—THE SELECTION OF JESUS

- 5. How is a high priest chosen?
- 6. Exodus 28–29 describes the great honor and respect given to the position of priest. Why does that make it seem even more remarkable that "Christ did not exalt Himself to be made a high priest, but was appointed" (5:5)?
- 7. The quotes in verses 5 and 6 come from Psalms 2 and 110. Read these two psalms, then list additional things you learn about the Messiah.

8. Read Genesis 14:18-20; Hebrews 7:1-4. Who is Melchizedek?

DAY 4: HEBREWS 5:7-8—THE QUALIFICATIONS OF JESUS

- 9. What did Jesus do during His life on earth that was like the ministry of the high priest?
- 10. When was verse 7 fulfilled in Jesus' life as recorded in the Gospels (Luke 22:41-44)?

DAY 5: HEBREWS 5:9-10—THE DESIGNATION OF JESUS

- 11. The words *perfect* and *mature*, which often have the same meaning in Scripture, can be defined as *complete beyond improvement, fully developed*. Explain how *perfect* or *mature* is used in each of the following verses:
 - a. Romans 12:2
 - b. Ephesians 4:13
 - c. Hebrews 6:1
- 12. a. Read John 3:1-8, 16-17; 1 Peter 1:18-21. Explain how Jesus "became the source of eternal salvation" (Hebrews 5:9).
 - b. How does your belief in Jesus as "the source of eternal salvation" affect your relationships with people who do not yet know Him as their Savior?

DAY 6: PARTICIPATE IN CLASS

APPLY what you have learned. Jesus has been "appointed to act on behalf of [us] in relation to God" (5:1). Is there any aspect of life that does not matter to God? Our physical and our spiritual needs are important to Him. "Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?" (Matthew 6:26, 33). Everything that matters to us matters to Him! And, because He understands and cares, we are encouraged to boldly approach Him to ask for help.
